LIFE PROGRAMME

- European Union's financial instrument supporting environmental and climate protection measures under European Commission competence, founded on additionality principle to other financing sources
- The only EU programme targeted to protecting the quality of nature, halting and reversing the biodiversity loss, supporting the implementation of the 7th Environment Action Programme, and focusing intensively on the Natura 2000 network

The general objective:

 to contribute to the implementation, updating and development of EU environmental and climate policy and legislation by co-financing projects with European added value



LIFE 2014–2020 – legal framework

- ☐ LIFE multiannual work programme for 2014-2017 (Commission Implementing Decision 2014/203/EUof 19 March 2014
- □ LIFE multiannual work programme for 2018 2020 (Commission Implementing Decision (EU) 2018/210 of 12 February 2018)
- Grant agreement of the coordinating beneficiary with the European Commission
- Partnership agreements of the coordinating beneficiary with the other partners - so called associated beneficiaries



CO-FINANCING RATES

The total programme budget for the two sub-programmes: 3,46 billion €

Project financing from LIFE programme:

- 60% for years 2014-2017
- 55% for years 2018-2020
- Projects related to the priority habitats or species (Directive 92/43/EEC) or priority birds species (Directive2009/147/EEC) under the priority area Nature and Biodiversity – are financed by 75% during the whole 2014-2020 period
- Note: obligatory own co-financing by the beneficiary



FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

1. Natural Capital Financing Facility (NCFF)

- a new financial instrument; pilot implementation under both of the subprogrammes with aim to test and demonstrate innovative approaches to financing the <u>projects of preservation of natural capital</u> in priority areas Nature and Biodiversity, and Climate Change Adaptation
- combination of direct and indirect project financing in the form of loans or equity investments

2. Private Finance for Energy Efficiency instruments (PF4EE)

 a pilot financial instrument under Climate Action sub-programme which will test a new approach of commercial financing for <u>investments in energy</u> <u>efficiency projects</u> contributing to national prioritised

The **European Investment Bank** will implement the two new financial instruments by indirect management.



LIFE Call for Proposals 2018

The Call is published by European Commission annually.

The LIFE programme has launched its 2018 call for project proposals on 18 April 2018.

LIFE Call- eligibility of the beneficiaries

Applicant/Beneficiary

All legal persons (entities) registered in the EU are eligible to apply:

- public bodies
- commercial organisations
- non-commercial organisations (including NGOs)
- Responsibilities of project partners (according to the type of beneficiary):
 - Coordinating beneficiary based in EU (grant agreement with EC)
 - Associated beneficiaries (partnership agreements with coordinating beneficiary)
 - in specific cases based outside of EU



LIFE Call – project types

- So-called "traditional" projects
 - Pilot projects
 - Demonstration projects
 - Best Practice projects
 - Information, awareness and dissemination projects
- Integrated projects
- Technical Assistance projects
- Preparatory projects





LIFE in Slovak republic

National Contact Point

- Informing about the programme and opportunities for projects cofinancing
- Programme promotion, information events, conferences, and workshops in SR
- Advisory for projects preparation and implementation
- Providing co-financing from the state budget for approved projects
- Preparation and realization of co-financing agreements, monitoring of project implementation, financial control and verification of public procurement processes
- Representation of SR at the working groups and at the LIFE Programme Committee on EU level

National co-financing

Co-financing rates – depending on the type of applicant

- Budget and contribution organisations of the MoE SR 100% co-financing of the approved eligible costs of the total project budget that will not be financed by EC
- 2. Other applicants condition of 5% own co-financing; state budget co-financing:
 - max. 35% during the 1st LIFE multiannual work programme (2014 2017)
- max. 40% during the 2nd LIFE multiannual work programme (2018 2020)

(resp. up to 20 % of the total eligible project costs for projects that protect the priority types of habitats and species within priority area Nature and Biodiversity)

The call

The call for submission of applications for co-financing of the LIFE projects from the state buget

- Open call published by the MoE SR on 30. 12. 2016
- Indicative amount of the financial sources: 10 500 000 EUR
- 3 rounds of the call:
 - 1. round: for submission of applications for co-financing of LIFE14 and LIFE15 projects; application deadline **31.1.2017**
 - 2. round: for submission of applications for co-financing of LIFE16 projects; application deadline 31.10.2017
 - 3. round: for submission of applications for co-financing of LIFE17 projects; application deadline 31.10.2018





The call

The call for submission of applications for co-financing of the LIFE projects from the state buget

- The application shall be submitted to MoE SR within the deadline specified in the call
- Successful applicants → signing the co-financing agreement
- MoE SR shall sign a separate co-financing agreement with each beneficiary
- <u>Pre-condition for the co-financing agreement:</u> project is approved by EC and fullfils the criteria of the call and of the Mechanism for using the state budget financial sources for co-financing the LIFE projects in 2014-2020 programming period

- Slovak republic participates in the LIFE programme since 2002
- Successful participation of SR in the LIFE programme

LIFE III Programme

 Approved: 13 projects (with beneficiaries from SR) with total budget of 18 mil. EUR, where LIFE programme contribution represents more than 8 mil. EUR











Success of the LIFE Programme in Slovak republic

LIFE+ Programme (2007-2013)

Approved:

- 18 projects (with coordinating beneficiary from SR) in total amount of 32,8 mil. EUR, where the LIFE programme contribution represents 19,8 mil. EUR, and the state budget contribution 11,6 mil. EUR
- 5 projects (with participation of associated beneficiaries from SR) in total amount of 5 mil. EUR, where the LIFE programme contribution represents 2,7 mil. EUR, and the state budget contribution 2,2 mil. EUR







Success of the LIFE Programme in Slovak republic

LIFE Programme (2014-2020)

Approved until now:

- 2 projects (with coordinating beneficiary from SR) in total amount of 8,3 mil. EUR, where the LIFE programme contribution represents 4,9 mil. EUR
- 2 projects (with participation of associated beneficiaries from SR) in total amount of 1,2 mil. EUR, where the LIFE programme contribution represents 886 000 EUR
